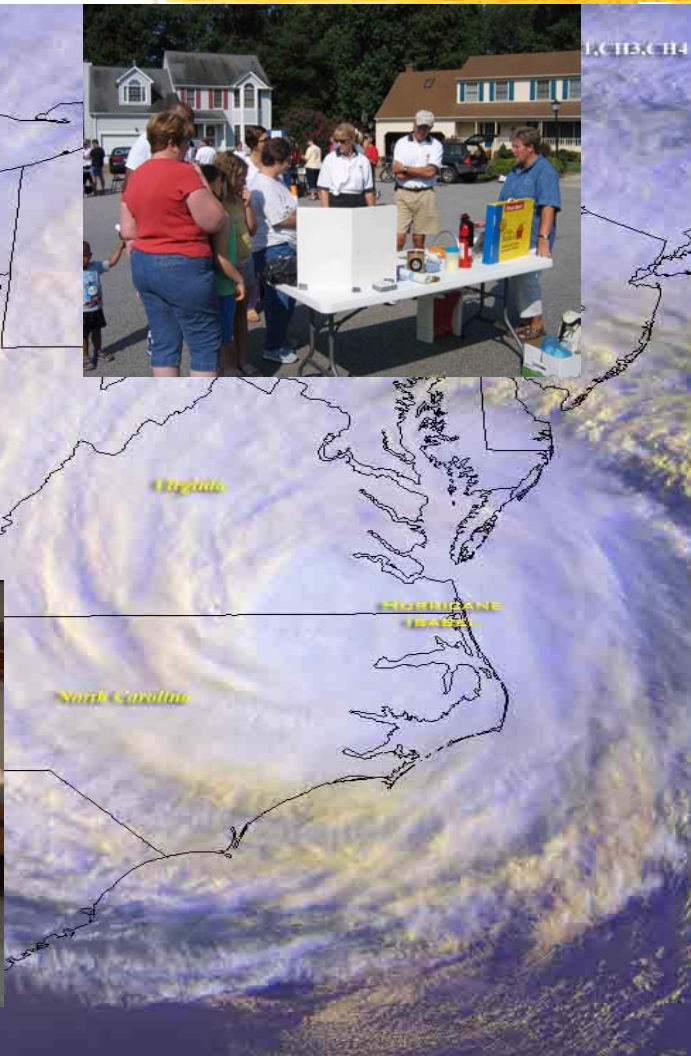

Tabb Lakes Emergency Response Program



GOALS:

- **Provide emergency preparedness information to the neighborhood**
- **Establish a group of volunteers to organize, train, and respond to emergencies**
- **Support our Community first responders after an event**

Tabb Lakes Emergency Response Program

Committee Status

- 30 Committee members, 14+ completed Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training.
- Approved neighborhood plan, ongoing training, and maintain a liaison with York County Fire Department.
- Designated a CERT Neighborhood.



Tabb Lakes Emergency Response Program (Ongoing Projects)

Education Program:

- **Conducted neighborhood training.**
 - **Fire Safety and First Aid**
- **Provided information to neighborhood on how to prepare for emergencies.**
 - **Updated Web site, newsletters, brochures and handouts.**
 - **Welcome packet developed for new homeowners**
- **Conducted local CPR/Automated External Defibrillator training.**



Tabb Lakes Emergency Response Program (Ongoing Projects)

Preparation and Training:

- **Conducted a table top exercise.**
 - **Review of different scenarios and equipment needed**
- **Developed a committee hurricane preparation checklist.**
- **Coordinated for the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) prior to a hurricane.**
- **Incorporating training into committee meetings.**



Tabb Lakes Emergency Response Program (Ongoing Projects)

Community Involvement:

- **Presented information at the James City County CERT Forum (March) at Fords Colony.**
- **Provided neighborhood information at the Hampton Roads Disaster Volunteer Day.**
- **Presented information to the Governors Landing CERT Committee.**



Tabb Lakes Emergency Response Program (Future Projects)



- **Neighborhood presentation on our program details. (Prior to hurricane season)**
- **Improve SOP:**
 - **Develop scenario driven checklist.**
 - **Incorporate ice storm procedures.**
 - **Improve assessment checklist.**
- **Future CERT in-house training and table top / hands on exercise.**
- **Future neighborhood training.**

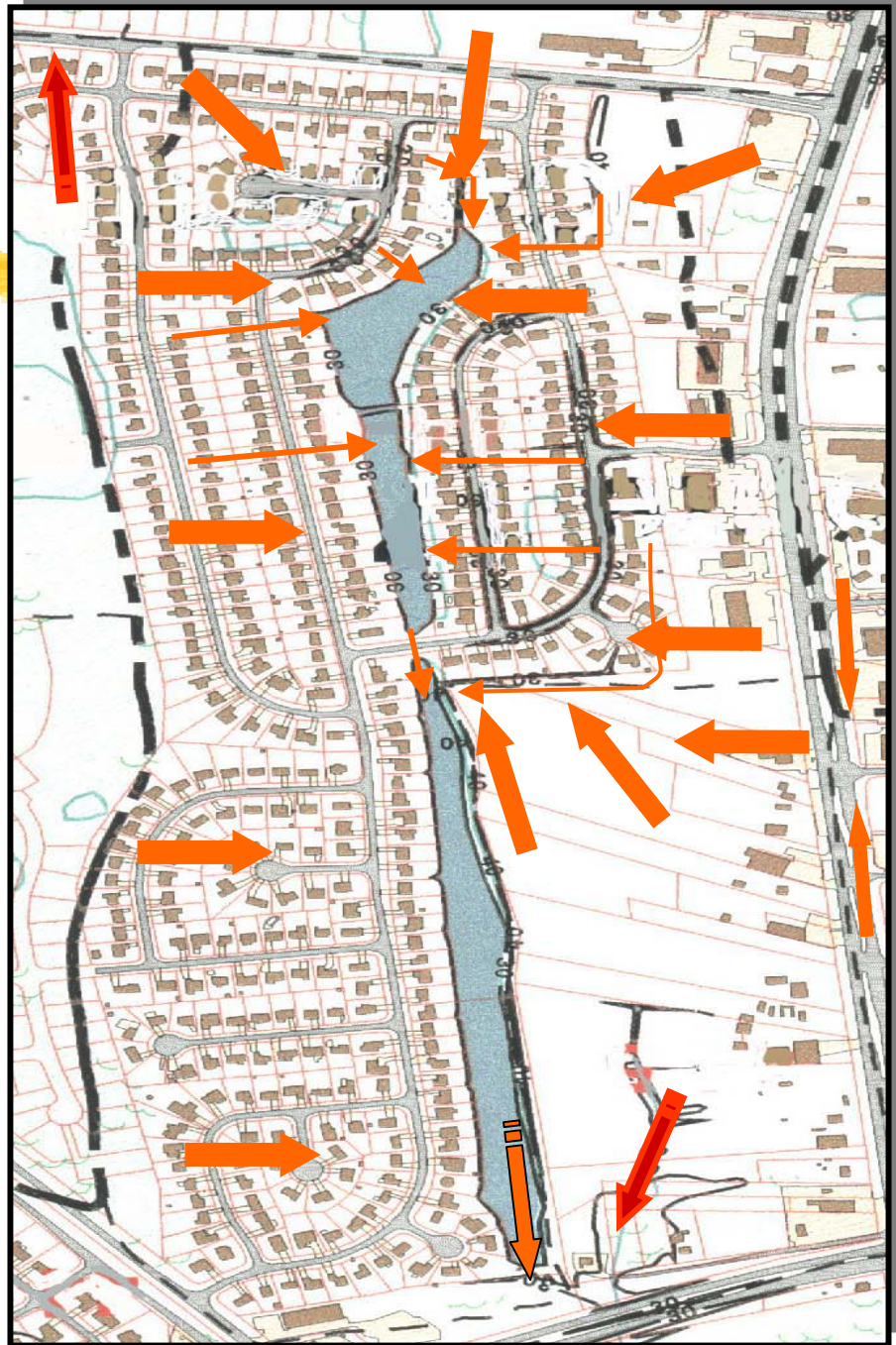

Stormwater Committee



Stormwater Committee

- Conducted most of our 10 point checklist of “things to do” to reduce the potential for flooding in Tabb Lakes.

- Three phases:

- Preparation for hurricane season
- Immediately before a hurricane or major storm
- After a hurricane / major storm

TABB LAKES Stormwater Committee Checklist	
Preparation for hurricane season (July/Aug)	
1.	✓ News article in the Tabb Lakes News Letter about preparing for hurricane season. (Lou Lafrenaye)
2.	✓ Clean out area around the outflow pipe at the end of Lake 1 and the drainage pipes near the intersections of Lake 1 and 2 to ensure no vegetation and debris is blocking water flow. (Lou Lafrenaye)
3.	✓ Notify homeowners along Adel Court and the end of Bridgwood Drive and ask them to clean out the large drainage ditch behind their homes. Warn about roofdrains. (Dave VanLear)
4.	Notify homeowners at end of Conway Court and ask them to clean out the large drainage ditch behind their homes. (Lou Lafrenaye)
5.	✓ Notify homeowners between Leslie Lane and Bridgwood Dr. to clean swale and drainage grates in back yards. This is the lowest point in Tabb Lakes and will flood. (Dave VanLear)
6.	Open all manhole covers in Tabb Lakes (about 14) and check for sediment buildup and trash. Measure sediment buildup. (Mike Gotsch and John Lau for Bridgwood side of Tabb Lakes) (Lou Lafrenaye and Larry Tenbessel for Gardenville side of Tabb Lakes)
7.	✓ Conduct Lake cleanup. Obtain boat and clean up debris in lakes that could block outflow pipes. (John Lau and Lou Lafrenaye)
8.	✓ Check of drainage system between our outflow pipe, under route 171 and out to route 134. Notify County staff if any problems. (Lou Lafrenaye)
Immediately before a major hurricane or storms that produces flood conditions	
9.	Clean out and monitor our outflow pipe and spillway to ensure drainage flow is unimpeded and lakes are at their lowest level. Check on a routine basis. (All. Lou Lafrenaye to coordinate prior to storm)
10.	Final checks of pipes and drainage areas to and under route 171, under Rt. 134, and pipes between Lakes 1 and 2. (Lou Lafrenaye)
11.	Final visual check of lakes for any debris. (All)
12.	Notify people along Adel Court / Bridgwood Dr. and at the end of Conway Court to remove any walkways and clean out debris in the drainage ditch behind their homes. (Lou Lafrenaye)
13.	Check under manhole covers along Bridgwood Dr. behind the homes between Bridgwood Dr. and Leslie Ln. and along Leslie Lane for debris. This is the lowest area of Tabb Lakes and will flood if any of these pipes are blocked. Remind people to clean areas in back yards along Bridgwood Dr and Leslie Lane. (Dave VanLear)
After a major storm	
14.	Check outflow pipe, spillway and pipe under Rt. 171 for blockage after storm. (Deil, Neal Naab and Lou Lafrenaye)

Stormwater Committee

- Checked status of drainage systems in our HOA and downstream
- Part of our preparation phase.



TABB LAKES Stormwater Committee Checklist	
Preparation for hurricane season (July/Aug)	
1.	✓ News article in the Tabb Lakes News Letter about preparing for hurricane season. (Lisa LaFrenay)
2.	✓ Check out area around for outflow pipe at the end of Lake 1 and the drainage pipe near the connection of Lake 1 and 2 to ensure no vegetation and debris is blocking water flow. (Lisa LaFrenay)
3.	✓ Notify homeowners along A&B Court and the end of Bridgewood Drive and ask them to check out the large drainage ditch behind their homes. (Lisa LaFrenay)
4.	✓ Notify homeowners at end of Conway Court and ask them to check out the large drainage ditch behind their homes. (Lisa LaFrenay)
5.	✓ Notify homeowners between Lexie Lane and Bridgewood Dr. to clean away and drainage gains in back yards. This is the lowest point in Tabb Lakes and will flood. (Steve VanLeer)
6.	✓ Open all manhole covers in Tabb Lakes (about 14) and check for sediment buildup and trash. Measure sediment buildup. (Mike Gilch and John Lee for Bridgewood side of Tabb Lakes) (Lisa LaFrenay and Larry Trechsel for Grayhaven side of Tabb Lakes)
7.	✓ Conduct Lake cleanup. Clean boat and clean up debris in lakes that could block outflow pipes. (John Lee and Lisa LaFrenay)
8.	✓ Check of drainage system between our outflow pipe, under route 177 and out to route 134. Notify County staff if any problems. (Lisa LaFrenay)
Immediately before a major hurricane or storm that produces flood conditions	
9.	✓ Check out and monitor our outflow pipe and spillway to ensure drainage flow is unimpeded and lakes are at their lowest level. Check on a routine basis. (All Lisa LaFrenay to coordinate prior to storm)
10.	✓ Final check of pipes and drainage areas to and under route 177, under Rt. 134, and pipe between Lakes 1 and 2. (Lisa LaFrenay)
11.	✓ Final visual check of lakes for any debris. (All)
12.	✓ Notify people along A&B Court/ Bridgewood Dr. and at the end of Conway Court to remove any walkways and clean out debris in the drainage ditch behind their homes. (Lisa LaFrenay)
13.	✓ Check under manhole covers along Bridgewood Dr. behind the houses between Bridgewood Dr. and Lexie Ln. and along Lexie Lane for debris. This is the lowest area of Tabb Lakes and will flood if any of these pipes are blocked. Request people to clean areas in back yards along Bridgewood Dr. and Lexie Lane. (Steve VanLeer)
After a major storm	
14.	✓ Check outflow pipe, spillway and pipe under Rt. 177 for blockage after storm. (Dell, Neal Nash and Lisa LaFrenay)

Status of Drainage System Upgrade

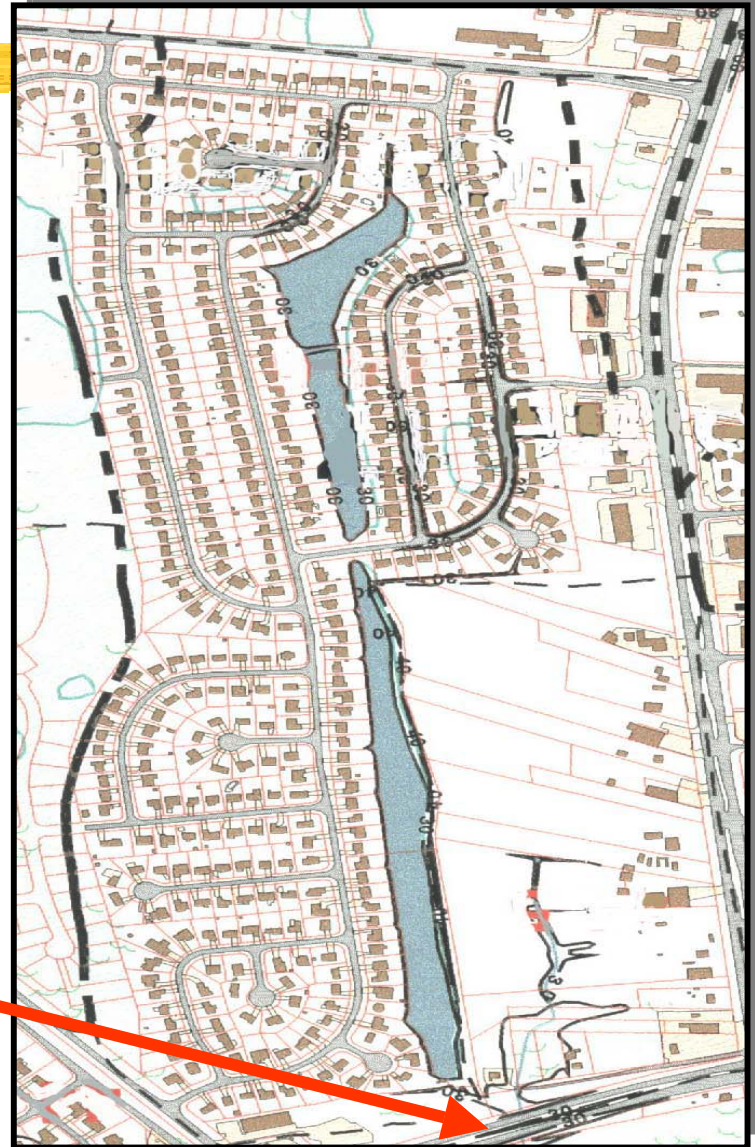


- York County Capitol Improvement Plan project for Tabb Lakes is underway !!!!!!
- Cost of \$810K to upgrade drainage pipe under Victory Blvd. and our Lake 1 outflow pipe.
- Pipe under Victory Blvd currently being installed by contractor. County will upgrade outflow pipe with in-house labor after completed.
